

QUARANTINE GUIDELINES FOR CLOSE CONTACTS AFTER A COMMUNITY OR NON-CLASSROOM EXPOSURE

This chart is used to guide quarantine decisions **after a student or adult contact is exposed to someone with COVID-19 in the COMMUNITY or outside of the school environment.** (For exposure related to the classroom, bus or school-related activities, see GUIDELINES FOR QUARANTINE OF A CLOSE CONTACT AFTER K-12 CLASSROOM/SCHOOL BUS EXPOSURE.)

A CLOSE CONTACT is anyone who has spent at least **15 minutes within 6ft.** of a known COVID-19 case while they were contagious. (48 hours prior to testing positive or 48 hours prior to the start of symptoms)

Is the CONTACT fully vaccinated?

A person is considered fully vaccinated:

- Two weeks after receiving a Booster for a two-dose vaccine (Pfizer or Moderna) **OR**
- Two weeks after completing the primary series of Pfizer or Moderna if it was received **within the last 6 months OR**
- Two weeks after receiving a dose of J&J vaccine if it was received within the last 2 months.

No

Close Contact should **not** attend in-person school or **participate in sports or extracurricular activities.** **Quarantine** 5 days from the last contact with infected person. **Separate** from others in the home.

After 5 days they can **return to normal** classroom IF they have not developed symptoms. They **MUST** wear a mask for 5 additional days at all times. and extracurricular activities

Test on day 5 if possible

Monitor for symptoms for 14 days.

If person **develops symptoms** get a test, isolate and stay home.

Yes

Vaccinated close contacts can remain in the normal **in-person** classroom setting and **participate in extracurricular** and sport activities as long as they have no symptoms.

Wear a mask indoors for 10 days and **test** on day 5 if possible.

Monitor for symptoms for 14 days.

If person **develops symptoms** get a test, isolate and stay home.
